WOLF HAVEN'S SPRING SPEAKERS SERIES CONTINUES SUNDAY

TENINO, WA-Wolf Haven International presents the second in a series of public talks about Washington wildlife. Julie Hopkins, of the highly acclaimed Grizzly Bear Outreach Project, will speak **Sunday, March 22, from 2:00 - 4:00 p.m. at Great Wolf Lodge in Grand Mound**. Her topic will include information about bear biology and Grizzly Bear recovery in the U.S.

Julie Hopkins is a Terrestrial and Marine Biologist and Science Education Specialist with over 18 years experience in animal and science research. A Threatened and Endangered Species specialist, she spent her career working with grizzly bears, spotted owls, and humpback whales and has conducted surveys for sensitive species ranging from beaked whales to peregrine falcons, big game, wolves and cougars.
