Are you looking for experience in Environmental or Informal Education? A Wolf Haven International Internship should be regarded as a part-time commitment of at least 20 - 25 hours per week for 10 consecutive weeks throughout our busy education season (March through June).

Wolf Haven is a nonprofit wolf sanctuary, founded in 1982, whose mission is to conserve and protect wolves and their habitat. Please visit wolfhaven.org to learn more about us. Our mission is accomplished, in part, through education, offering science-based programs, as well as guided sanctuary and prairie walks, to groups of all ages and backgrounds. As a paid or for-class-credit, the Education Intern will work with the Education Coordinator to deliver education through a variety of programs and presentations.

If an intern wishes to receive academic credit for his/her internship, it is the intern's responsibility to make arrangements with the sponsoring institution. Academic credit is up to the discretion of the intern's college or university. Wolf Haven International will provide the sponsoring institution any necessary reports or evaluations.

Internship does not lead to additional employment. Stipend, housing and transportation are not provided.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Learn and lead two to three of our most popular programs
- Learn and lead guided sanctuary visits
- Interact with the public on and offsite
- Assist with outreach booth events, as well as offsite programs
- Determine, develop, and complete a project that benefits you and Wolf Haven's Education Department
- Perform duties in all types of weather and facilities
- Demonstrate professionalism in appearance, attitude, and conduct

This position provides an opportunity to gain hands-on experience with a nonprofit organization, with opportunities for special projects.

- Interest in developing or enhancing skills as an educator/facilitator
- Interest in wildlife
- Comfortable with public speaking
- Ability to lead and work with diverse groups of people
- Self-motivated and able to work alone or as part of a team
