We hoped we wouldn't have to transport Angel to the clinic, since she does not handle anesthesia well. We kept a close eye on her, and that evening, during the final check of the day, she was seen sleeping in her shelter pen. Dear Angel passed away on her own overnight. Merlin was near her and that gives us comfort – to know she was in her home with her enclosure mate.
